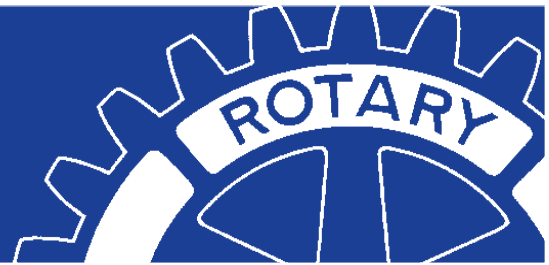

(ii) hold an important position in any worthy and recognized business or profession or any branch or agency thereof and have executive capacity with discretionary authority; or
(iii) having retired from any position listed in sub-section (i) or (ii) of this subsection.

The Classification/Membership Committee will use mid-management level as a minimum for membership criteria and discretionary authority is “able to commit either money and/or time”. (To be able to control own schedule.) Previous Rotarians who left their club in good standing will be given preferential consideration for membership in Club 21.

Accordingly, with respect to professional services, only proprietors, partners and principals would be eligible.

Chile Verde – Arribaaa!!!!

Ok, I agreed to do this because 1. – This really is one of my favorite dishes and 2. – Well, Lucretia TOLD, um, I mean asked me to. So, it is New Year's Eve and we are preparing the "All Mexican" dishes for our "New Year's Day Fiesta". It is not often that I am allowed, I mean invited to help in the kitchen. So I was happy that I was able to hang out and shred cheese, organize the various pots and pans needed for the following day and open the cans and drain them. Oh, there were olives and chiles and tomatoes, and yup, Chicken Broth. There we were, laughing and grating and chopping and draining. Well, I got so carried away with the draining that before I realized it – *I drained* the Chicken Broth, yes I did. (For those of you that don't cook much – the only thing in a can of chicken broth is **CHICKEN BROTH!**) New Year's Eve, stores close early and several of our recipes call for Chicken Broth, I just knew that I was going to be in big trouble and possibly fired from any more New Year's Eve preparations, lucky for me that Lucretia rolls with the flow. She was laughing so hard she was snorting and I thought I would never get her off of the kitchen floor where she sat holding her stomach she was laughing so hard. She obviously thinks this story is much funnier than I do because when I ask her if there is anything I can do to help her as she is preparing dinner, she starts laughing and *snorting* and asks if I will drain some *more* Chicken Broth for her! HA, HA, HA, very funny! And, I still get that request today!

Anyways, enjoy the recipe:

Chile Verde

| 1 lb. Tomatillos | 1 14 oz. can chopped green chiles |
| 5 hot chiles (poblano, habenero, jalapeno) you can either buy them and chop them individually or look for them mixed in a can-these are pickled and milder | |
| ½ red bell pepper | 1 tsp crushed garlic |
| 1 small onion | 1 can chicken broth |
| 2 lbs pork – shoulder or boneless type ribs (also the Costco pork tenderloin or seasoned pork tenderloin works well) | |
| pinch of onion powder | pinch of garlic powder |
| Lawrey's season salt | Olive oil |

- Put pork in crock pot – season with garlic powder, onion powder and Lawrey's. Cook on low until tender.
- Boil the tomatillos for 15 to 20 minutes. Drain and cool with cold water. Peel outer brown skin off and throw away
- Blend cooled tomatillos in blender or in Cuisinart.
- Chop chiles and red bell pepper and blend in Cuisinart, add to tomatillos. Do the same with the onion.
- Add the can of chopped green chiles to the mixture.
- Chop or shred the cooked pork.
- Put a small amount of olive oil in a skillet, (Dutch Oven, or Electric Skillet) add crushed garlic and pork, stir till warmed through. Add tomatillo mixture and chicken broth. Simmer on medium low for about an hour or until most of the broth has cooked off and the mixture is mushy but not runny.

Serve with sour cream on top. (Warm tortillas on the side to dip is really nice.)

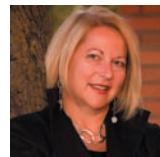
